



INTRODUCTION

- 1. There is now agreement within the water supply and sanitation sector globally, and in particular, in India, that no meaningful programme can be effectively implemented and sustained without community participation and without upgradation in human resources. In India, many agencies local/bilateral/multilateral are therefore focussing on decentralised water and sanitation programmes, in which the communities themselves play a major role in decision-making and water resource management. In other words, the project staff and beneficiaries work as partners in planning, implementation and management of water resources and environmental sanitation. Involving beneficiaries at each of these stages requires the provision of information, training and education to facilitate two-way communication. However, the experience in India during this past decade has brought to the fore certain major problems:
 - The lack of educational/communication materials audio/visual/written;
 - Information on the availability and use of such materials;
 - The availability of these materials at all levels, from senior management to grassroots level; and
 - The lack of networking among organisations throughout India involved in using and producing communication materials.
- 2. These problems have resulted in much duplication in the production of materials to support community-based initiatives in the water supply and sanitation sector. This also highlights the lack of contact between different agencies and the absence of a few clearly identified and publicised centres that collect, catalogue and disseminate materials. Communication materials are largely context-specific and the immense diversity in language and culture across India further intensifies the complexity of the problem.
- 3. Experience has shown that, though each case is different, and requires special inputs, it is of great help to trainers to have access to textual/pictorial materials prepared for a different geographical region but on a similar subject. They may not be able to exactly duplicate that material to meet their own particular needs, but it would give them sufficient concrete examples and the confidence to proceed with adapting that material and then possibly developing their own materials
- 4. To initiate and facilitate this effort, the Voluntary Health Association of India (VHAI), with funding from Danida and support from the UNDP/World Bank Water and Sanitation Program, launched on the project to establish a communication materials data bank for community-based water supply and sanitation initiatives for the rural poor.
- 5. The project aimed at the establishment of a communication materials data bank with the following objectives:
 - To collect educational/communication materials, including audio/visual/written material, from institutes/organisations/NGOs which are involved in the development, production and dissemination of material related to rural community-based water and sanitation activities.
 - To catalogue and index the collected materials using different criteria levels of applicability, language, geographical area, subject, etc.
 - To disseminate the information collected.

- 6. As the first step, it was decided to collect samples of materials already available from three distinct regions of India Rajasthan, Tamil Nadu and Delhi, review them in terms of origin, development, production, dissemination and use; and develop a simple cataloguing and indexing system to retrieve materials for different purposes.
- 7. It is hoped that once this system has been developed on a small scale, based on the material collected during this one-year project, which is demonstrably easy to use, it will generate interest and enthusiasm among users and producers of communication materials in all other states throughout India, to share the materials they have produced with the VHAI data bank so that others may benefit from it
- 8. This publication contains a detailed catalogue of the material that has been collected by the Information and Documentation Division of the VHAI during this one-year project. The material is available for all organisations/institutions/NGOs who are involved in developing communication materials in the field of water and sanitation

Visual Aid, New Delhi. 73 slides.


A slide set containing information on personal hygiene, such as brushing of teeth, combing hair and eating clean food.

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Adhar Shodh Sansthan



Adhar Shodh Sansthan, an NGO working in Shivdaspura near Jaipur, Rajasthan, has come up with a very innovative communication method to spread awareness on water and sanitation. They organise *mehndi* competitions in the Chaksu block of Rajasthan. Only, in this case, the women competitors cannot use the traditional floral designs to paint their palms and feet with the paste of henna leaves. Illustrations showing the hygienic handling of water is the theme of these competitions. This programme is a big hit with illiterate women and schoolgirls, who have responded very positively to this form of popularising health education.

Avvai Village Welfare Society




Avvai Village Welfare Society (AVWS), Kilvelur, Tanjore district, Tamil Nadu, has effectively demonstrated that involving school children is a powerful vehicle for communicating messages on health and hygiene. Children are eager to learn and anxious to demonstrate their capabilities.

Moral instruction given at the beginning of the day in schools and balwadis are on water and sanitation. Special information and training sessions are aimed at the parents in order to get them to inculcate good personal hygiene in their children.

Songs on the theme of water and sanitation, in the local dialect, are a motivating factor for the children. Other activities include clean-up campaigns, proper use of school kitchen gardens and investigating the health behaviour and conditions in their own homes.

Emma Communications



Emma Communications, Madras, Tamil Nadu, is involved in the production and distribution of a variety of communication materials in the form of posters, flashcards, audio cassettes, puppets, etc. The issues taken up by EC are health and hygiene and family planning. A very successful communication strategy employed by them is the pictorial newsletter with cartoon strips. The cartoon is called 'Kutti Doctor' — and it gives first aid tips to children. Each issue takes up a particular ailment and explains in simple Tamil, the treatment required. For example, one issue discusses diarrhoea and its prevention using ORT solution.

The colourful, wallpaper-size newsletter, with its simple messages, attracts schoolchildren and is widely used in schools in Tamil Nadu.

Involvement Of School Children



School children are encouraged to write songs and prepare slogans in their local language, on development issues, especially water and environmental sanitation. Children eager to demonstrate their capabilities participate, with great keenness, in the writing of songs and slogans and spread the message contained in these songs and slogans to those around them.

INDEX

USING THE INDEX

- 1. The index that appears on the following few pages has been created with the aim of facilitating retrieval of information about the communication materials listed in this publication. To achieve this, an effort has been made to devise an index which will allow retrieval of information on a number of parameters. These are:
 - Subject matter of communication materials
 - Titles of communication materials, alphabetically listed
 - Reference number under which the material is listed
 - Page number on which it appears
 - Medium/form of the materials
 - Geographical origin of the materials
- 2. The index is divided into two parts: the first is an alphabetical list of all the materials, with their reference numbers and the page numbers on which they appear; the second a matrix setting the reference numbers against subject headings, and using colour and alphabetical coding, respectively, to represent geographical origin and medium/form of materials. Using these two parts in combination should allow users to easily gather most of the basic information about an individual item or a particular category of materials.

LOCATING MATERIALS

3. By subject:

• Use the contents list on page 3 to easily locate materials on the basis of their subject matter.

4. By name:

• Use the alphabetical list to locate the reference number of any item whose name you are aware of, and get basic information about it from the matrix, or go to the relevant page number (also accessible from the alphabetical list) for detailed information.

5. By place of origin:

• Scan through the matrix for reference numbers with the relevant colour coding, simultaneously getting basic information about medium and subject of material; then use the reference numbers to locate the items in the main listing.

6. By medium:

• Scan through the matrix for reference numbers with the relevant alphabetical code, and proceed as above

EXAMPLES

7. To locate all materials available on school health:

• Use the contents list on page 3 to locate materials on the subject of 'School Health' — these are to be found starting from page 24. Turn to page 24 for complete list.

8. To locate details about publication named 'Why Is The Cat So Healthy?':

• Use the alphabetical list to locate the reference number (VIII.19) of the material, and the page number on which it is featured (page 27) Then turn to this page to get complete details, or refer to the matrix on page 54 to get basic details — that it is a booklet on the subject of school health, brought out from Rajasthan.

9. To locate all materials brought out from Rajasthan:

 Scan through the matrix for reference numbers with the medium grey colour used to denote all materials brought out from Rajasthan, simultaneously getting basic information about medium and subject of material; then use the reference numbers to locate the items in the main listing.

6. To locate all booklets:

• Scan through the matrix for reference numbers with the alphabetical code 'BL', and proceed as above.
