- To construct water & sanitation facilities for meeting basic needs & providing privacy & convenience especially for girl students
- To provide opportunities for experiential learning & behavioural development among students & teachers concerning clean environment, sanitation, hygiene & safe water use
- To reach out to parents & other community members for promotion of latrine construction & use as well as adoption of improved hygienic practices at household level





## Double Unit LatrineUnder School Sanitation Programme






Figure 1. The Process and Concerned Agencies/Actors in the Programme





Figure 2. A Framework for School Sanitation & Safe Learning Environment



#### Criteria for Selection of Schools

- School with no latrine and tubewell
- School with at least 150 students
- School having class rooms with walls
- School with their own land to construct latrine & install tubewell
- Ten percent schools from each thana to be selected from non-government registered schools
- Equitable distribution of schools by union
- Schools having piped water supply should not be selected

#### Lessons Learned

- Attendance of girl students raised 11% on average.
- Privacy provided for girl students by separate latrine was an important factor
- Quality of construction & maintenance of water & sanitation facilities improved remarkably over the year
- Percentage of running tubewells increased from 68% to 89%
- Satisfactory discharge of water increased from 55% to 95%
- The status of clean & flushed pans increased from 36% to 80%
- Quality of materials used & overall construction by SMC were cost effective as per specification, & plan design
- Contractors hired by DPHE generally quoted costs that were 80% higher
- SMC promoted & ensured participation, empowerment, & sense of ownership among community
- SMC encouraging local capacity building & better management of WATSAN facilities
- School children are very effective in promoting their parents to build and use sanitary latrines & keep them clean

- Ninety two percent teachers got training & 96% of them are actively teaching lessons on hygiene & sanitation
- Fund for maintaining WATSAN facilities raised from 7% schools (1994) to 44% schools (1995)
- Soap or ash was kept next to water facilities in 52% schools
- For completion of construction SMCs took 28 days as opposed to 7 to 10 months by contractors




